ORDER

WHEREAS the Lieutenant Governor in Council issued Order-in-Council No. 194 February 1, 1982 and directed the Commission to hold hearings on any applications received for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity for the construction and operation of a system of cable undertaking; and

WHEREAS the Commission issued a public notice advising of the terms of reference of Order-in-Council No. 194; and

WHEREAS Pioneer Cablevision Ltd. has applied for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity by an Application dated July 2, 1982; and

WHEREAS the Application was heard by the Commission in Vancouver on August 18, 1982; and

WHEREAS the Applicant commenced the operation of a system of cable undertaking in the Deroche, Agassiz and Harrison Hot Springs areas in 1977.

NOW THEREFORE the Commission orders as follows:

- 1. Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity
 No. T-17-82 issue to Pioneer Cablevision Ltd.
 covering the ownership and operation of a system
 of cable undertaking for the conveyance or transmission of information, messages or communications
 other than broadcast signals for compensation
 serving the Deroche, Agassiz and Harrison Hot
 Springs areas, all as more particularly described
 in the Application and hearing record, subject
 to the following condition:
 - (a) The service offered by the undertaking must be provided at the rates and under the terms of service described in the Application and the hearing record.
- 2. A complaint which the Commission finds is related to a matter which may be in contravention of the guidelines for enforcement of the obscenity provisions, Criminal Code of Canada may be referred to the Attorney General for investigation and the Commission may suspend the Certificate until such matter is concluded.
- 3. No variation or alteration in the Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity or this Order may be made without the approval of the Commission first obtained.
