Inc. to Mascon Communications Corp. (Chase); and

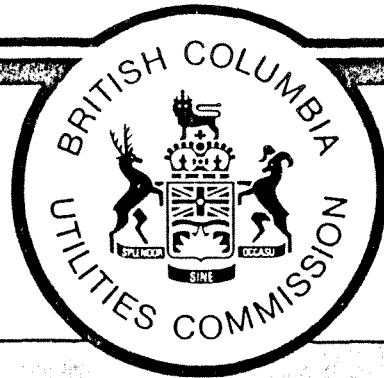
WHEREAS the Commission has reviewed the circum-
